Alison has been serving with YWAM's Native American Ministries among Southeastern tribes the past 15 years, including organizing a Day of Remembrance in 2008 for the 170th anniversary of the Trail of Tears. This ceremony brought together federal and state government officials with the Cherokee. Last year she gifted land in Moravian Falls, North Carolina, to Cherokee believers from Oklahoma.

She is currently writing a book *Peace Warriors: A New Day Dawns for Native Americans*. The book includes personal Native stories of discovering their identity in Christ, forgiving historic injustices, overcoming addictions, and raising their voices to share amazing testimonies and God-given wisdom. She believes the First Nations are the key to revival in America ... and the nations.

Prior to the Lord's call to Native American reconciliation, Alison served with YWAM's University of the Nations as a trainer of young adults from many nations. She led intensive schools – the School of Journalism on Capitol Hill in Washington, DC and the School of Government & International Studies in Lausanne, Switzerland.
